

- [7] Applications will be considered by the Trustees in May each year and must be received by the Clerk by **no later than Saturday 31st March 2012**. Applicants will be advised of the outcome in June.
- [8] Successful grant applications will be paid by cheque. On completion of the project the Trustees would expect to receive copies of relevant receipts and an explanation (which could include photographs if applicable) of the benefit of the grant to the school/cluster.

Bishop John Wordsworth established this Trust for the purpose of promoting Christian learning within the church schools of the Diocese of Salisbury.

The Trust is managed by a Committee of six Trustees who meet yearly and a Clerk who deals with all administration matters.

Current annual income is in the order of £20,000.

In 2003/4 mainly due to the general downturn in investment returns, it became necessary to place a moratorium on grant making. This provided the Trustees with an opportunity to take stock and to consider the future.

In 2006/07 this led to the re-launch of grant making with a focus on "**Special Projects**" and the Trustees have agreed to continue this focus for 2011.

## APPLICATION CRITERIA

- [1] Grants normally to a **maximum of £500** (on occasion the Trustees may consider more) are available per school to aid any special project which focuses on the **creative** aspect of religious education, ideally showing good curricular links. In the case of secondary schools the maximum may be increased up to £1,000 if funds permit.
- [2] Applications for grants towards **transport costs** will no longer be accepted.
- [3] Applications must be made on the official application form and can now be submitted on a yearly basis.
- [4] Single applications are encouraged from school clusters for larger projects.
- [5] Grants are limited to one per school/cluster. **Priority will be given to applications from schools that have never applied before or did not apply during 2011.**
- [6] If funds permit, the Trustees will consider two year sequential funding for larger projects.
