Love and Sex Matters

Relationships and Sex Education in a Context of Christian Values

- An important and realistic resource to help children and young adults to navigate the complex context of modern sexuality.
- Written in the light of the MacDonal Review and The Children's Society's A Good Childhood Report.
- A useful resource for schools engaged in the spiritual, emotional and moral development of pupils.
- Engaging activity-based lessons with guiding questions for discussion.
- Materials written in consultation with teachers and tested with classes.
- Separate and complementary resource packs written for Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 (with resources for KS1 and KS4 to follow).

The resources aim to:

- Help children and young adults question the role of the media and advertising in forming attitudes about the human body.
- Ask pupils to ponder the profound meaning and significance of sex and consider the spirituality of relationships.
- Allow exploration of a variety of religious and non-religious responses to issues of sexuality.
- Uphold the sanctity of marriage, long-term relationships and stable family life as the building blocks of a content life.
- Enable teachers to confidently teach these difficult topics using material that is underpinned by the central belief in the intrinsic worth of all people as loved and created by God.

Each pack includes:

- Seven lesson plans and the materials to support the lessons (incl. a CD-Rom with powerpoints and printable PDF's), a sample relationships and sex education policy and questions that a governing body might like to consider when forming a policy, and finally, suggested ways of informing, and working with, parents on relationships and sex education.

Key Stage 2: Relationship Matters

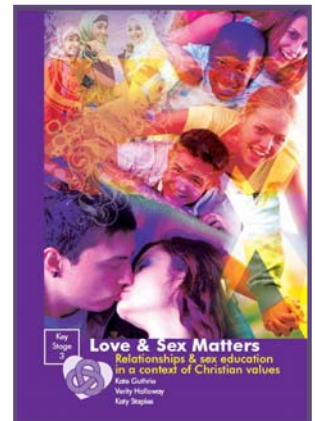
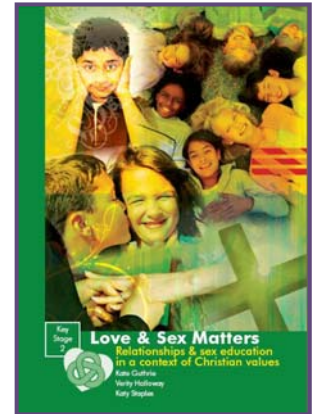
The sessions for Key Stage 2 are structured in imitation of how relationships develop: starting with the individual, followed by wider community, then dating, marriage etc. The aim of this is to put sex within the context of marriage and to help pupils understand how relationships develop and work. The sessions will explore factors that create identity, how we make good relationships, puberty, the meaning of sex, marriage and forgiveness.

Key Stage 3: Sex Matters

The material for Key Stage 3 is more directly related to sex throughout, focusing on how society and our communities form our attitudes about sex and influence sexual activity. The sessions will explore the role of media in shaping sexuality, what is love?, why wait?, emotional and spiritual aspects of sex, contraception, STI's, the importance of commitment.

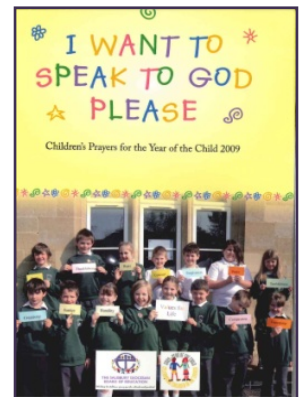


I Want to Speak to God Please

Children's Prayers for the Year of the Child 2009

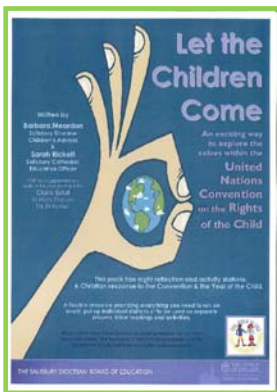

A Christian response to the 20th Anniversary of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), and the Year of the Child 2009



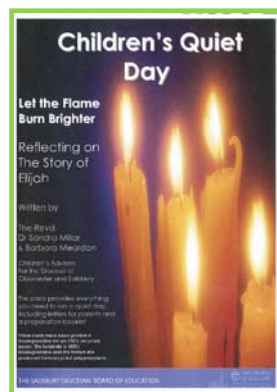

It includes detailed instructions and pictures to help you set up the eight stations, and experiential opportunities for children and adults alike to think about and respond to the challenge of the articles. Going on retreat has long been recognized as being beneficial for adults. This pack aims to open the experience of retreat to children, allowing them to go away from their usual environment to a specific place to be alone with God in a 'more silent and focused' way. This children's quiet day includes elements that adults who have been on retreat would recognise: silence, liturgy in chapel, subdued music, visual elements, leadership by a spiritual director, solitude, group discussion and reflection on the Bible. 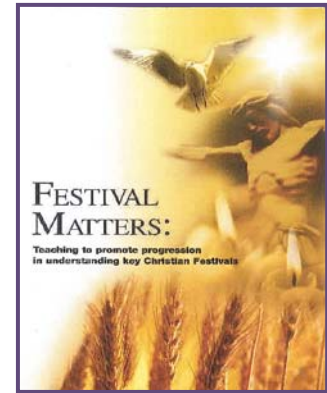

- Provide opportunities to develop and enhance the pupils' multi-cultural understanding.

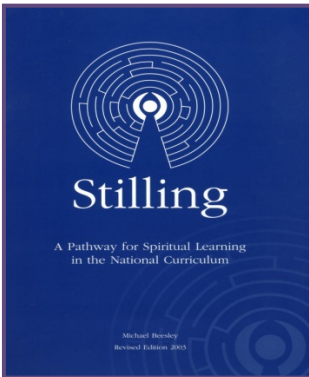


The schemes comprise a unit of work for each year group from Reception to Year 6. There is a different theme and emphasis for each year.

Pupils themselves have said how much they appreciate the activities and look forward to them as a regular source of inspiration and spiritual refreshment. The booklet describes 'Stilling' and suggests ways in which it may be introduced and applied in the National Curriculum.
