
Week three: 4 - 11 June

Day 22 Sunday 4 June [Trinity]

Today is Trinity Sunday. The liturgical season of Trinity can sometimes seem to be never ending and testing of our stamina. For Christians, there is no retirement; we keep on keeping on making Jesus known.

Prayer

Day 23 | Monday 5 June

Day 24 | Tuesday 6 June

Jesus taught his disciples in parables, including that of the sheep and goats: "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family. you did it to me."
