## Early Morning Eucharist

This simple early morning Eucharist at 7.15 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday is an optional service.

## Morning Prayer

The whole Conference will gather for Morning Prayer at 8 am in the Derbyshire Hall on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday morning.

## Evening Worship

Evening worship will be in the Derbyshire Hall and will be informal in style. Music will be led by Nicki Rogers.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, our evening worship will incorporate a

45 minute bible study on the book of Jonah.

## Late Evening Worship

On each evening there will be two possibilities for late evening worship, of varying styles.

On Wednesday, to mark the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation, one of the options will be Thomas Cranmer's 1552 Holy Communion service.

## Closing Eucharist

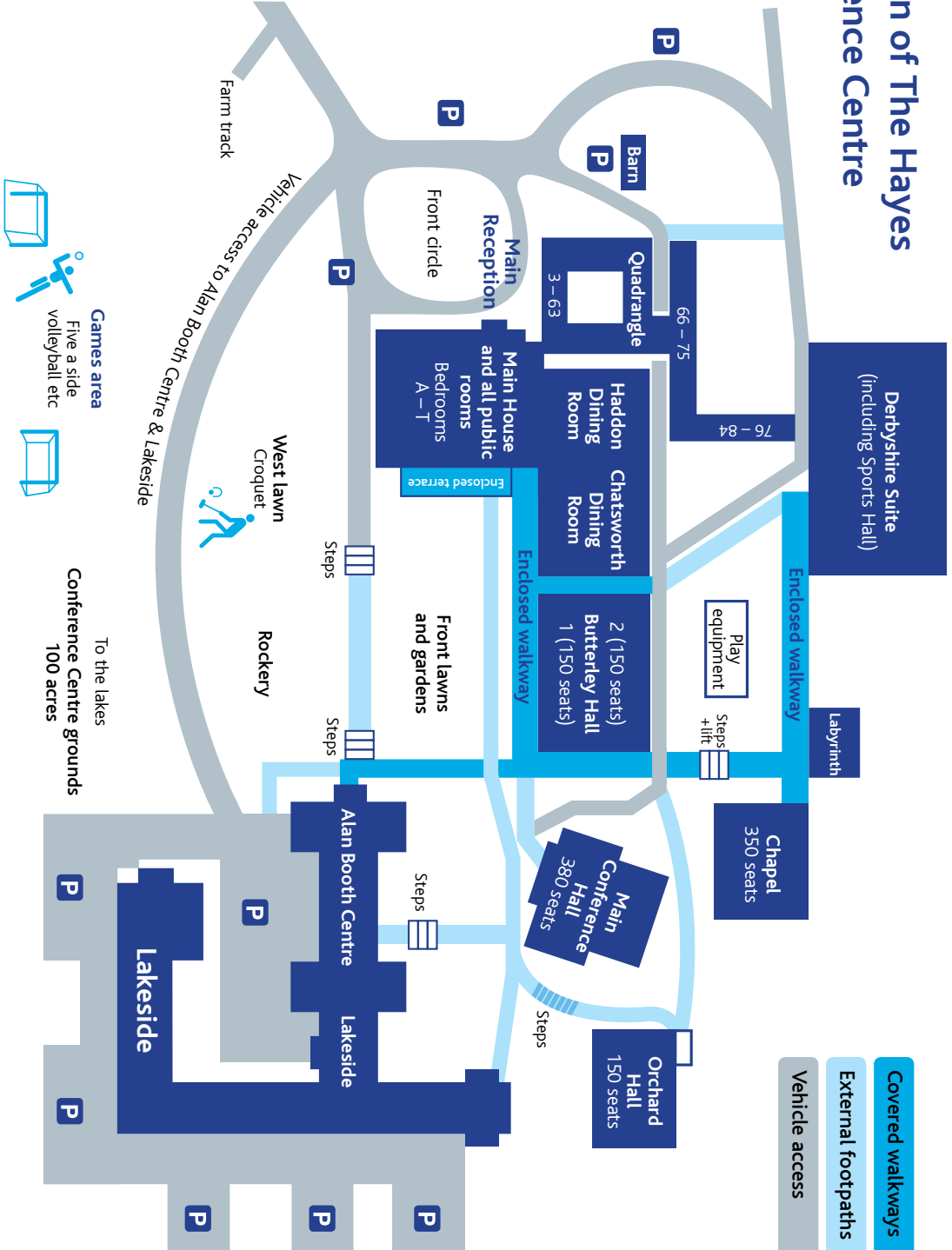
