



***Doxecology* by Resound Worship—a new album of contemporary, congregational worship songs on themes of creation, ecology and Christian hope—will be released on 1 September 2020.\***

Alongside the 13-track album there are scores and charts, backing tracks and lyric videos (with streaming permission), and an accompanying book of studies with contributions from some leading scholars and practitioners in the fields of environmental concern and worship.

## **ABOUT DOXECOLOGY**

The *Doxecology* collection is the result of a two-year writing process. It began as a response to the growing climate crisis and the recognition of a disconnect between these real concerns and the language and content of our songs in church. As a songwriting team, we strongly believe that what we sing forms us as Christians and reinforces our priorities in life. We really couldn't find much else out there on this subject. And we love nothing more than to explore a gap area.

We began by reading, researching and studying – getting to grips with developments in theology, recognising that we had a lot to learn before we began to write. Some way into the project, we felt it was growing bigger than us, so we opened it up into a worldwide search for songs from other writers, for which we had 150 submissions. Several months of sifting, editing and honing later, and the final collection was assembled. Throughout the writing process, we were kindly supported by the (now retired) President of *A Rocha International*, Peter Harris.

Careful plans to record the album live at a multi-generational retreat over Easter were suddenly shelved with the arrival of Covid-19. We had to quickly develop a new approach and a new sound. Producer, Matt Weeks, drafted in musicians with their own studios and recording facilities who could work within the lockdown conditions. This opened up new possibilities for contributors, including the acclaimed producer, conductor and percussionist Troy Miller (Amy Winehouse, Laura Mvula, Gregory Porter) on drums and Mark Edwards (Katie Melua, Ben Castle, Stuart Townend) on piano. As is the usual style for Resound – who operate

more as a team of songwriters than 'artists' – guest vocalists contributed to most of the tracks. These include Gemma & Timo Scharnowski (*The Forest Feeling*), James Martin, Matt Tinsley, Paul Zach (*The Porter's Gate*), Silla Mosely, Ryan Flanigan (*Liturgical Folk*) in addition to Resound's own Andy Clark & Geraldine Latty. Group vocals were provided in lockdown by many participants in our 12 Song Challenge, a monthly songwriting initiative.

The accompanying *Doxecology Study Guide* includes 13 chapters of Biblical reflection to accompany the album, a resource which we hope will be used as a devotional by individuals, and a study primer for small groups. In addition to members of the Resound Worship team, contributors include Jeremy Begbie (*Cambridge/Duke University*), David Taylor (*Fuller Seminary*), Dave Bookless (*A Rocha International*), Rachel Wilhelm (*United Adoration*), Sara Hargreaves (*Engage Worship*), Jack Wakefield (*Tearfund*) and Jeremy Williams (*Christian Climate Action*). The book concludes with three *Doxecology* service outlines, created by *Engage Worship*, including prayers, poetic readings and all-age worship activities.

'*Doxecology*' is a portmanteau of *doxology* (praise) and *ecology*. We stumbled across it when playing around with album title ideas, back in 2018.

"As Christians with a growing awareness of the environmental crisis, and as worship leaders in our own churches, we were increasingly aware of the need for these two areas of worship – loving God, loving his creation – to come together in song. We know that the words of our songs are powerful, they influence our theology and they shape how we see the world. It is all too easy for worship songs to lapse into a dualist message where the earth is something to be escaped and heaven the prize, when the true Biblical narrative is of an eternity on a restored earth with Christ. We set out to write songs that would feel at home in a typical contemporary service, not overstating the themes to a point of awkwardness, but weaving them into the styles and language of our regular worship. For us, this has been a transformative process, a journey of revelation, confession, and hope. Our prayer is that these songs would lead others on that same journey."
