



THE BISHOP PIKE TRUST FUND

The Bishop Pike Trust Fund was established during the late 1980s in memory of Bishop Victor Pike, Bishop of Sherborne from 1959 to 1976, who was a much-loved figure in our diocese.

The Trust started with hundreds of donations from those who had known him. The income from this capital is used to make small grants, from £100 up to £600, to the children of stipendiary and non-stipendiary clergy, for a wide range of educational projects and other worthwhile activities connected with school and college and in the immediate post-school period, outside main school and university fees.

For example, it can help with the cost of music lessons, sporting activities or field trips for children and young adults of school age and above. The Trust also makes contributions to worthwhile gap-year projects, and helps with the cost of books as well as IT equipment when students go to college.

Administered by the Diocesan Board of Education, the Trust is particularly concerned with the assistance of hard-pressed clergy in the Salisbury Diocese.
